

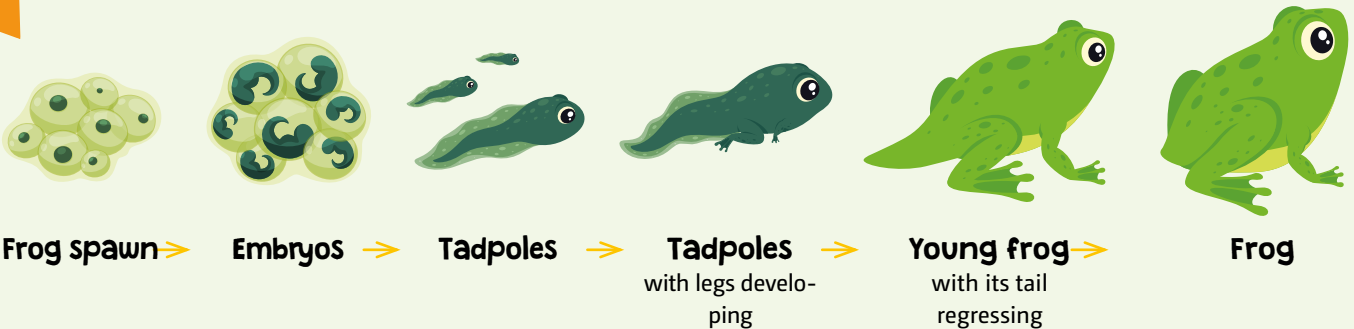


Frogs

There are many different types of frogs in the world, but you can recognise all frogs by certain characteristics. They all have a rounded body, long, powerful hind legs and short front legs. They usually sit in a crouching position at the water's edge or on the leaf of an aquatic plant.

Frogs can come in many different colours, such as green, brown, red or yellow. They catch their food with their long tongues. There are also frogs that spend most of their time in the water.

Many species of frog also lay their eggs there. These eggs are called frogspawn. From these, small tadpoles develop, and later small frogs.



Frog Fact Sheet

- **Habitat:** Found on every continent and in almost every habitat; they live on land and in water.
- **Age:** 3 to 20 years old
- **Behaviour:** During the day, frogs often rest and become active at night and at dusk; when danger threatens, they retreat to deeper water. Frogs spend the cold season hibernating underground, at the bottom of water bodies and in dense piles of leaves.
- **Diet:** Insects, larvae and worms
- **Communication:** Frogs communicate by croaking



Tumbling Quaki

* WHAT YOU NEED:

- Scissors, glue, glass marble and maybe adhesive tape

Print the template on sturdy paper, cut it out and fold along the dotted lines.

First, apply glue to surface 1.

Glue the square cylinder together.



Apply glue to surface 2 and fold the side flaps over each other. If necessary, fix them with adhesive tape.

Place a glass marble (approx. 17 mm in diameter) into the box and close the other side as described in step 4

Finally, you can stick the frog on the front and back.

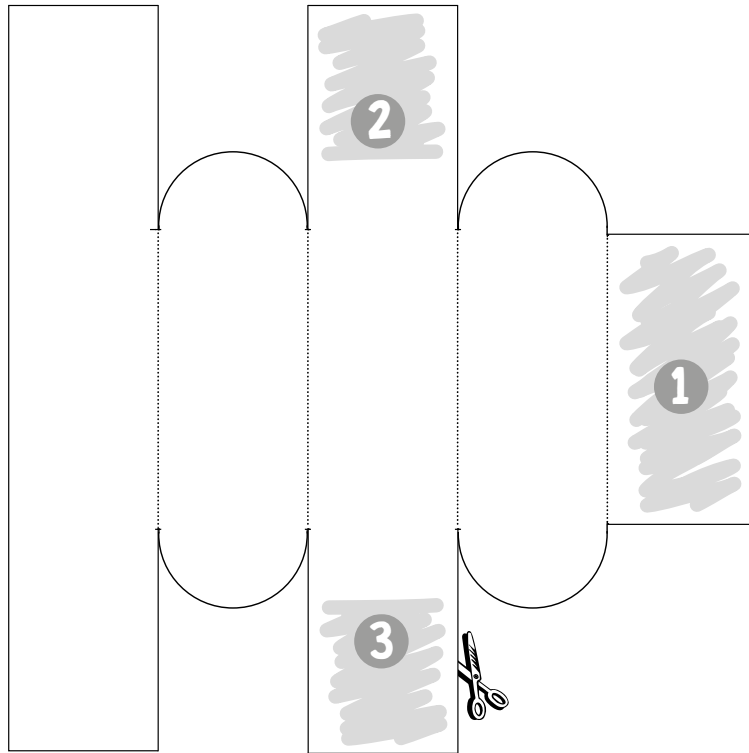

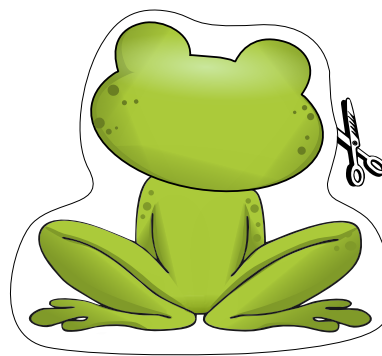
